Will I be safe on this trip? Educational Opportunities (EO) has a long-standing commitment to safety. You are in less danger in Israel than you would be on a trip to New York City or Washington D.C. Not only is Israeli security vigilant and aware, your tour guides and EO representatives will be with you at all times. What makes me safe? 1 Security on planes bound for the Middle East go through several additional security precautions and procedures. 2 Security within Israel and Palestine is much more strict than within the USA. 3 Statistically, the crime rate in Israel and Palestine is lower than the typical US city, including your home town! 4 It is a small place... just 50 miles wide and 150 miles long. It is easy for our office to keep a watchful eye on situations in various regions of Israel and Palestine. 5 To our knowledge, no Christian Pilgrim from the USA has been killed in Israel during the last 42 years. 6 Since our first Holy Land trip, more than 37 years ago, we have never had a major incident.
