CALLED CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

In April, 2016, RPC called the Reverend Jackson as a Designated Pastor with a 2-year contract. Pursuant to the Presbytery of Chicago's Committee on Ministry requirement, the RPC Personnel Committee solicited formal written reviews for Pastor Jackson from 7 members of the congregation, representing a cross section of RPC members by age, sex and length of involvement in church activities. A report of these reviews was presented to the Session at its August meeting.

In response to this review and the Personnel Committee's report, the Session calls a Congregational Meeting for September 17, 2017 immediately following Worship, for the purpose of acting on its unanimous recommendation to change Rev. Jackson's call from Designated Pastor to Called Pastor and approve his new terms of call, listed below. If approved, the action takes effect January 1, 2018.
