**MISSION GIVING**—BEDS+ in need of help. "BEDS helps individuals and families experiencing homelessness, but we've found that the best way to end

homelessness is to stop it from ever happening. We safely shelter people and help them return to housing on the fair market or in units that we have built or leased. These approaches work well, but they demand significant investments from staff; volunteers; communities; and clients' time, energy, and patience during a harrowing period in their lives. For the first half of this fiscal year from July 1, 2020, through Dec. 31, 2020, BEDS has spent about \$220,000 in rental assistance to help about 127 households."
